### NATIONAL SPECIALTY PUTS SPOTLIGHT ON 'PRESERVING AND PROTECTING' THE BREED

#### The DPCA Raised \$50,000.00 for Rescue and Medical Research and Launched Local Breed Education Initiative

Oct. 31, 2006 - The Doberman Pinscher Club of America (DPCA) today announced that through its 81st annual National Specialty, held last month in Aurora, Colorado., it raised over \$50,000.00 to support its humane Doberman Pinscher rescue initiatives, and to fund veterinary medical research for dogs of all breeds. The event also provided a platform for disseminating positive messages about the breed to more than 100,000 Colorado residents.

"We believe this year's National Specialty provided a significant opportunity to reach the general public, cultivate relationships with those in a position of influence, and begin the long-term process of changing minds about breed-profiling in the Colorado area," said Jeffrey Helsdon, DPCA Board Member and Legislative Director. "It is important to cultivate these kinds of educational moments everywhere we can, but particularly in markets impacted by breed-specific legislation (BSL)." Denver, Colorado enacted an ordinance requiring the confiscation and killing of some breeds in 2004. Aurora, Colorado followed suit last year.

Highlights from the Club's local educational initiative include:

- Outreach to Colorado legislators and 20 members of the local press with positive information about the breed
- Securing the participation of Aurora City Council Member Renie Peterson and local K-9 units from the Denver area as special guests of the Club during the Nationals, as well as demonstrations from local bomb and cadaver detection dog teams
- Reaching nearly 126,000 Denver residents through the local ABC affiliate's coverage of the Top 20 Agility event
- Presentation of the 2006 Friend of the Dog Award to Cesar Milan, The Dog Whisperer, for his support in the fight against BSL

"Our organization has been a proud ambassador for the Doberman Pinscher for nearly a century," said Dr. Sam F. Burke, Jr., DPCA president. "I am pleased that our National Specialty continues to serve as an opportunity to spotlight our breed's best attributes."

#### Dr. Mary-Helene (Mimi) Brown Futurity Puppies and Grand Prize Futurity

Thank you all for the honor of judging Futurity Puppies and Grand Prize Futurity at the 2006 DPCA National in Denver. I thoroughly enjoyed seeing so many wonderful young Dobermans up close.

6-9 Black Dog: This first class of 23 has some very promising future winners. I gave first place and reserve 6-9 to a handsome 6 month old with good bone and substance, and very pleasing head. His expression and bearing were true Doberman type and he showed beautifully.

6-9 AOAC Dog: A red puppy took this class of 10. He was balanced front and rear and was a good mover. His head was lovely and his mouth correct. He was a strong, solid youngster in excellent condition.

6-9 Black Bitch: There were 29 in competition and this class was the hardest to judge because of the number of very good bitches. I could have used at least 10 of these pups, if I had that many ribbons. 1st place went to an elegant 6 month-old, who had extraordinary ring presence. Her head and expression were lovely and she kept asking to win in the final class go-around. I found it interesting that 3 of the 4 placements were sired by the same dog and that two were littermates.

6-9 AOAC Bitch: From this class of 10 emerged the best 6-9 puppy winner and eventual Grand Prize Futurity winner. She was a striking young bitch with great presence. She was very square in profile with a smooth flow all of a piece from head to neck to topline to tail. She moved cleanly down and back and had good reach and drive in the go-around. I look forward to following her show career.

I was very happy with my best 6-9 puppy line up. All four were very good and it was a tough choice. The red puppy bitch has the most correct outline and the best overall movement.

9-12 Black Dog: There were only 4 in this class and the 1st place dog stood out. He was a little straight front and rear, but is balanced and had the best head of the group and moved well. He was the winner of best 9-12 puppy.

9-12 AOAC Dog: Again, with only 4 in the class, a fawn dog stood out from the rest. He had heavy bone and good substance and moved well. He had a nice dark eye and good coat condition. He was the reserve 9-12 winner.

9-12 Black Bitch: The 1st place bitch was a vision in black and rust. She had the look of a true working dobe without any loss of elegance. Her head was pleasing and her movement free flowing. I later learned she had place first in the regional sweeps and regular 9-12 class and she went on to win her class at the nationals. She is surely one to watch.

9-12 AOAC Bitch: The class winner was a well put together, had a good front assembly and moved well. She also won this class at the regional and the national specialties.

Best Puppy was awarded to the 6-9 red bitch. She looked lovely and square and moved beautifully.

Grand Prize Futurity: I had two gorgeous red bitches in this class. I tired to start fresh and judge these two in the moment. The 12-15 AOAC bitch was very nice, but my final decision was based on better movement on the down and back by the puppy winner and her square outline, level topline, and smooth flow.

I believe with this day of lower entries, that a change to one Futurity judge may be in order, as the juniors have a hard road, when the puppy judge gets to see just one. It is interesting that the regional sweeps winner was a junior dog and that the last few GPW winners have all been from the puppy classes.

Most of the Dobermans I saw were well put together. I did see some serious faults, including pigeon breast fronts, over angulated rears, straight fronts, and mouths with missing teeth and small teeth. There were several lacking in underjaw and some lacking bone and substance.

I am very grateful for the opportunity to judge at the 2006 DPCA National Specialty and thank the DPCA membership for this honor. ▲



## Theresa Mullen 2006 DPCA Regional Puppy Sweepstakes

First and foremost, I would like to THANK the DPCA Membership for electing me to judge the Regional Sweeps this past September 23, 2006. And also extend my THANKS to the many exhibitors who showed their beautiful Dobermans to me. I am honored and humbled by this opportunity.

I had a very big entry... 141... and the overall quality of the entry was extraordinary. When I had the four puppy class winners lined up for Best Puppy, they were truly an outstanding group. They all showed proper breed type with correct heads, fronts and rears, exceptional toplines, neck sets and overall proper movement. I really could have pulled up a chair and just kept looking at them. They were that impressive of a group of young Dobermans. It was a pleasure to have them in the ring to judge.

For BEST PUPPY I chose a stunningly correct red male from the 6 to 9 month class....GEMSTONE RAVENNA ALISATON NAGANO shown by Carissa DeMilta. This puppy was so outstanding. He just never put a foot down wrong and looked correct every time I looked his way. He's the style of puppy that, because of his overall breed type and soundness, continued to catch my attention and he made me want to keep looking at him. The more I "put him under the microscope", the better he looked. He is such a sound, honest dog all the way around.

The 6 to 12 month puppies, as a group, had many beautifully proper, Standard conforming members. But I saw many that needed much improvement with heads, toplines, fronts and proportions. Head planes were off, eyes were set too close, muzzles lacked fill and underjaw and many had way more "leg" under them than depth. Poor toplines and neck sets continue to plague our breed with dips in front of the wither, dips behind the wither, high hips and sloping and short croups. Mouths were not showing any trends and I saw only a few with missing teeth. Temperaments on the Puppies and Juniors were good to excellent.

The JUNIORS as a group were very outstanding in their overall breed type and soundness. They were showing

far fewer problems as a group than the younger puppies.

The heads were much better as were toplines. I didn't see the "mountain range" look on the older group that I saw in the puppy classes. Neck sets were far more correct, overall, and the high hip with its sloping croup was not as prevalent in the older group. This tells me that we, as a group of breeders, need to remember the importance of the correct topline and how it relates to correct transfer of drive from the rear assembly to lift and propel the front forward.

My final four in the Junior division were just breathtaking, and once again I wanted to just keep looking at them....they were so pleasing to the eye and proper to the Standard.

I chose as my BEST JUNIOR a red dog, CH. CAMBRIA'S COMMANDER IN CHIEF, shown by Ann Ramsbottom-White. This dog was very correct overall and dripping in masculinity. He displayed a beautiful, proper head, flawless topline and dynamic movement. He had such intensity and attitude and confidence that he just exuded true Doberman temperament.

When the Puppy and Junior winners stood in the ring for BEST IN SWEEPS, I was very proud and fortunate to have these two outstanding Dobermans to pick from. The only disappointment for me was that I had to chose only one to reward.

In the end, I chose the JUNIOR dog, CH. CAMBRIA'S COMMANDER IN CHIEF for BEST IN SWEEPS. He presented himself with intensity and determination and powered around the ring, And every time I approached him to take a look, he stared at me with those intense "laser" eyes that projected he was all Doberman!

The Sweeps was a pleasure to judge... so many wonderful Dobermans. I was very impressed with many of the Puppies and Juniors and all my class winners and placements in the classes showed much breed type and correctness.

I was honored to judge the first DPCA Regional Dog Show and I received a great deal of pleasure while doing so. The entry was large and when all of the Doberman Pinschers were entered into The ring at one time, the sight was quite impressive.

First the males came into the ring and were followed by the bitches. I judged the entries in approximate groups of 10-12. As each group left the ring, the ring steward would post the armband number of those that were to return. As the event neared completion, I was very pleased with the quality of the entries.

As for the qualities possessed by the Dobermans exhibited in comparison to the DPCA Standard!

In my opinion, we need to work at producing more Doberman Pinschers that are of medium size, square, with straight-level topline, possessing bone & substance with hindquarters than balance correct forequarters.

There were some outstanding specimens in the ring and many very good Doberman Pinschers. We can be proud of our breed. There were several young specials that have great potential. Some specimens were extreme but possessed parts that were outstanding.

I thank you all for allowing me the opportunity to judge your specials and I will never forget the experience. This experience makes me realize how much I missed campaigning a Doberman Pinscher, the best of the breeds.

#### Judy Smith 2006 DPCA Regional Puppy Dogs/Adult Bitches

First of all I'd like to thank my ring stewards, Ms. Tammy Rabold and Ms. Robin Kelley for keeping the ring in order and doing such a professional job all the way around. Thank you ladies for all your hard work... Also would like to thank the handlers, owners and our dogs for their end of entering and competing in the first ever Regional hosted with our National Specialty... a wonderful venue for us dog lovers.

The first class of puppy dogs was an awesome sight when I first went down the line. Wow before I even got into the nuances of our breed, felt breed type was present and saw bone making, hopefully, a comeback. I do like my dogs to look like males and my bitches to be just that, bitchy, with an elegance to type. When I divided this group and then started to individually examine my entrants, I began to find some things in some of them that began to worry me somewhat. Down the line in one's breeding program the narrow lower jaws crowding teeth, and a lot of extras, without the correct one being in the proper place, is going to come around and bite US. Some of these narrow muzzles and lack of underjaw are remonstrate of our collie mouths. When all this crowding starts and lack of space on a jawbone to put teeth, we surely will start finding the loss of teeth. Also overbite was seen, but then again in this age group jaws keep growing for quite a while so I wasn't so worried about this. I also began to see some of this in bitches. I'm not just applying this to the dogs. Back to the young dogs—at this age there has to be some give on toplines as well as some being able to use their rears efficiently. Getting more rear muscle will correct this. High tailsets were evident and thus one more cause for inefficient movement and being able to use their rears efficiently. Another thing I found was some of our dogs are getting very 'long'—in loin and long in ribcage. I'm a little more lenient when it comes to the bitches. When I ended up with the groups that were to include my class placements, I felt these represented the best on that day of judging. Having lived with puppies one week they are fine and the next week they're long, high in rear and goodness only knows what else they go through... I was pleased with heads... it has been a while since I've seen nice heads that represent the planes, wedge and eye shape with adequate muzzle length as well as underjaw.

We certainly had representatives in both dogs and bitches. Eye shape is coming back from the round eyes that are set more to the sides of their heads giving a very odd look to their 'walk up first impression' of heads. Also fill is beginning to give the under eye area a fuller wedge coming forward. Ear sets are good on the whole. Some complain about the ears being too long, too short - remember we are the ones that set length and clean out of the lower ear when we crop. Our front ends have improved but it seems we have forgotten about rears and balance. If you have one without the other, then you've compromised balance which is cause and effect for poor movement. The "hams" (rears) still represent problems with lower stifles being long, lean, too lean to have adequate muscle and ligaments to use in movement and get under themselves to drive forward.

Even though the bitches had some of the same problems, I again felt we had good depth in quality in the classes. Some more so than others... Toplines had some problems but when bitches are coming in or going out of season there is a tendency to get soft in this area so you have to judge what you see on that day. Bone seems to be somewhat of a problem with the girls—some are deemed fine, while others almost appear doggy. I found good compromise with some of my placements. I also had some rather big girls that prompted me to ask birth dates to my ring stewards. I'm not a judge who likes real big but in some circumstances felt conformation qualities versus the size warranted a class placement. We are getting incorrect body proportions in that we've got way too much leg... My Bred by Exhibitors classes were so fine that I could easily have gone with any of the class placements... This is where the breeders bring the cream of the crop and it certainly was evident in this class. And, of course, this is where I found my Winner's Bitch... She was my 'prototype' of a standard, balanced and structurally near correct. The woman showing her needs to let her out when gaiting as she's structurally made to move with fluidity and ease in the go around. She's lovely in her head with underjaw we'd like to see in all our dogs, as well as full muzzle, level planes adequate length of muzzle to backskull and eyes that are dark and of good shape.

Her teeth were large and white and filled the whole of her jawbone. Her neck flow was lovely to feel when you put your hands on her neck that flowed into her back. No pronounced withers but a constant smooth flow into her topline. She was short in back had a correct tailset. Her front end was underneath her shoulder blades, even when she stopped on her own. Some of our front ends are so far forward that if you tried to place the legs under them any further, they would fall on their noses. Her rear was adequately muscled in even comparison to her front in angle as well as equal bone structure of upper and lower front and rear bones thus resulting in fluidity and elastic movement on the go-around. Her movement on the diagonal was clean with no elbows, pastern flipping or moving too close or wide in her front or rear. Body proportions were just right for my choice of the standard, not overdone, and size of this bitch. Upon approach in my examination of her, she gave me the look that I knew she would 'stand her ground'... rightfully so, as she was my Winner's Bitch. . .

My Reserve Winner's Bitch from the 9-12 puppy class was a "type" akin to my Winner's Bitch. All in one piece and the parts flowed into each other in a correct angle. She has lovely bone and substance. Hopefully she'll get her rear under her as she matures more.

For her age, she uses herself quite nicely. When I looked at the pictures on our Show Photographers graphic machine, the WB and RWB looked very similar. It'll be interesting to watch this bitch as she matures and graces our ring again.

I'd like to thank our membership for voting for me to do this Regional. I appreciated the opportunity to judge such deep quality in a great venue . .

## George Murray 2006 DPCA Regional Adult Dogs/Puppy Bitches

It was a great honor to be asked to judge the 2006 DPCA Regional Specialty in Colorado. Having just retired as a professional handler a mere three years ago, I was flattered to be invited to this prestigious event so early in my judging career.

I came to this National this year, with no preconceived notions or ideas as to what I was going to put up. In preparation for the assignment, I reviewed the new Doberman Pinscher Illustrated Standard. While reading the standard, it struck me that the first paragraph states the essence of everything a judge needs to remember: "The appearance is that of a dog of medium size, with a body that is square. Compactly built, muscular and powerful, for great endurance and speed. Elegant in appearance of proud carriage, reflecting great nobility and temperament. Energetic, watchful, determined, alert, fearless, loyal and obedient". That is the Doberman Pinscher. That was the template that I tried to use for every Doberman that I judged.

Overall, I had some very nice dogs. I saw a few dogs with round eyes. I can remember only two dogs with one missing premolar, and only one with a missing incisor. Unfortunately, there were quite a few dogs with extra premolars on the left side. There was only one dog that still had the baby tooth beside the canine tooth. Sometimes those baby teeth take their time dropping off. Some of the dogs were long in loin. Plus a few tailsets were too high. I had two classes where I had the dogs in the final line up, and after I moved them around for the last time, I saw the need to bring the second place dog to front of the line. My reasoning was that the second place dog was better in reach and drive than the first place dog.

When I got to end of adult dogs, I brought in the four 1st place puppies to evaluate before judging winners. These were the junior winners put up by Judy Smith. I took my first look at the four

puppies in the line up and said to myself: 'I am going to use something from this wonderful class of puppies'. I looked down the line of all the class winners and thought, 'This is a nice line up'. Of course, a judge can only pick one winner.

I get the most enjoyment when I bring each dog out to center ring and have him stand on his own without touching him in any way. I want to see a stallion standing there on all four feet saying, "Look at me. I am the best here today!" I picked my Winner's Dog from the Bred-By AOAC class, and my Reserve Winner's Dog was the 6-9 AOAC puppy dog. Both dogs were exceptional examples of the breed and on any given day could have been put up in reverse order. I wish that my second place in Bred-By AOAC could have come back into the ring to compete for Reserve Dog.

The next day I started out judging the puppy bitch classes. What a great sight to see. My 9-12 Black Bitch ended up going Reserve Winner's Bitch under Judy Smith. After the judging was over, I learned much to my delight that the 6-9 puppy AOAC winner is the litter sister to my Winner's Dog. It is always rewarding to discover this kind of consistency in the results of your judging. That breeding must have really clicked as these were two exceptional puppies.

I would like to comment on one more aspect that struck me during my judging assignment. I was very impressed with the sportsmanship of both the handlers and the exhibitors during competition and after each class was over. Well done... all of you.

It was such an honor to judge this breed.









