


Thank you ALL for your hard work. If I have left anyone out, I apologize. It takes a big effort to do the DPCA National, you all deserve a standing ovation.





National & Regional JUDGING

Comments from the Judges...

Connie Alexander

Judge - DPCA National Intersex



The opportunity to judge the Intersex class at the 2012 National Specialty Show was a rare honor, and I want to convey my thanks

to everyone who helped to make the show a success. Being selected to judge the top dogs in my breed was truly a life-long dream come true. Special thanks go to my ring stewards, Skip Thielen and Barbara Bender for all their help and support. Literally, I could not have made it through the day without their help. Skip kept me organized and directed, and Barbara kept us both in line. They both did an outstanding job.

One of the bonuses of this judging assignment was judging the non-regular classes. It is a joy to see all of the veterans flying around the ring, as though they were still young dogs. The two older bitches were amazing, putting on display their ring talents from the past. Judging the Brood Bitch class was more difficult than I had thought possible, as all five bitches displayed quality get, and it was a formidable task placing them.

In an entry of this size and quality, I saw many different styles and types. Overall, breeders have been successful producing dogs that adhere to the standard. The heads were generally good, with the occasional round eyes or missing teeth. Bone and substance was sufficient in most dogs. Our standard states that the Doberman should be square, with the height equaling the length of the body. There were many dogs that did not meet this criterion. The other observable deviation was the short upper arm and the overangulation of the rear. Correct angulation, front and rear, gives the breed its characteristic silhouette, as well as its athletic ability. Improper angulation causes the topline to slope to the extreme, resulting in an inability to perform efficiently as a working dog. Doberman breeders need to concentrate on developing proportionality in our breed in the future.

My Best of Breed winner has a stellar ring presence. She is elegant, carries herself well, and has the "Look of Eagles" when she is in the ring. She has a good head with a lovely expression, a compact body, good angles, and demonstrates efficiency, when she is moving. She never let down during the judging, remaining on her game at all times. My Best of Opposite, Select Dog, and Select Bitch all were compact, had proper heads, had strong top lines and were balanced front and rear. All four of these top dogs moved with good reach and drive. Further, every dog in the ring for final judging represented quality and varied little from dog to dog. They were all admirable examples of our breed.

Again, I wish to thank the membership of the DPCA in selecting me to judge the Intersex class. It was a joy to judge the top examples of our breed, and the memory of this day will always be special to me.

Judge - DPCA National Bitch Classes

I would like to thank the membership for once again giving me the opportunity to judge at the DPCA National Specialty. This is such an honor and I approached the assignment, as I always do, on a 'treasure hunt'. I was not disappointed as there were many treasures to enjoy. Congratulations to the breeders for the improvements made over the past few years.



The majority of the bitches were more balanced than in recent years and over-angulation in the rear appears to be on the decline. Movement on the down and back was the best I have ever seen! Sadly, very few bitches displayed the efficient reach and drive called for in the Standard. Fast and taking more steps than necessary is neither efficient nor correct. Heads are improving but we still do not have the beautiful correct heads of the past. Eye shape and eye placement need to be addressed. I found it depressing that 2 bitches, each with 3 missing teeth, were exhibited. I hope they will not be bred.

Almost without exception, tail sets were horrible. Flat croups and tails carried at high noon are not only ugly, they are dysfunctional. The 'grapevine' must have been buzzing because I noticed the distinct absence of exhibitors cranking up the tails. Thank you!

I was very pleased with my Winners Class. All had the requisite components as I interpret the Standard; medium size, square, compactly built, muscular, powerful, well angulated with strong reach and drive, elegant, self-assured, energetic, and sound in mind and body. I would be proud to have bred each and every one of them.

I must also acknowledge and give a big Thank You to my fabulous Steward, Skip Thielen, without whom my day would have been so much more difficult!

Judge - DPCA National Veteran Sweepstakes

There was an entry of fourteen Veterans. While only first place was awarded in each class, there were several very deserving dogs. For the most part these Veterans were in good shape and sound. While there were many missing teeth, that happens with slab fractures and other dental problems over their long lifespans and were not penalized.



The Best in Veteran Sweepstakes was a beautiful red bitch. Ch. Kelview's Diamond V Nova CDX RA OA OAJ NF. As it turns out this bitch from the 9-11 year class is still competing in agility and had the beautiful body, which comes with constant conditioning and exercise. She had a nice layback, surprisingly good feet for her age and the fact that she still runs in agility, a beautiful headpiece, and

a hard top line with a beautiful tail set. She is owned by Sally Wolfe and Colleen Nicholson. Rumor has it that she also won Grand Sweepstakes two years ago from the 7-9 Veteran class.

My other winners were:

Judge - DPCA National Dog Classes

Thank you for asking for my comments on the Dog judging at the Doberman Pinscher Club of America National Specialty.

The entry was a young entry with the majority of the dogs less than eighteen months old. I was encouraged to see many lovely young dogs with significant potential to make a contribution to the breed.



In general, I found many positive attributes, including pleasing heads, properly shaped dark eyes, good frontal scissors bites, and complete dentition on most exhibits. There were some instances of extra teeth, very few missing teeth, and many instances of faulty to very-faulty side occlusion.

Toplines varied from straight to sloping, and proportions varied from the correct square outline to long in body and loin. Many exhibits were longer than tall.

Most dogs had adequate bone, tight cat feet, good body weight and muscling and excellent condition of skin and coat.

I was impressed, as always, by the temperament of the dogs - including the puppies - standing their ground and accepting handling and examination.

Winners Dog was a masculine, moderate dog of substance. His square proportions, straight topline and balanced angles allowed him to move confidently and correctly coming and going. He had strong reach and drive with a controlled sidegait, and held his outline in motion. He had a pleasing head with dark eyes and a good mouth. He was confident, energetic, alert and stable.

Reserve Winners Dog was a handsome red puppy from the 6-9 month class. His proportions were right and he was moderate throughout. His straight topline, correct neck set and tail set gave him a very typical outline, standing and moving.

It was my pleasure and honor to have the opportunity to judge the Dogs at the 2012 National Specialty. \blacktriangle

Judge - DPCA Regional Bitch Classes

First and foremost I wish to thank all those that voted for me to judge at this year's National. It was truly an honor to have been selected as one of the Regional judges. I selected bitches this time and I have to say with all honesty that there were many beautiful bitches worthy of the final nod. When my winner's class came in to the ring it was overwhelming how



many beautiful ones there were to choose from. I just could not pull a couple out in the beginning which is why I brought the whole line up out into the middle of the ring. My Open AOAC bitch was very smooth and balanced. She moved around the ring effortlessly with a clean up and back. She had a lovely expression and great presence. She ultimately became my Winner's Bitch and went on to be awarded Best Of Winners. For my Reserve there were at least three more bitches that could have been awarded that honor, I chose my 6-9 Black Puppy Bitch, who again was very balanced, smooth and a great mover. Other bitches worth mentioning were the 9-12 AOAC Puppy Bitch and the Bred By Exhibitor AOAC bitch, both of wonderful quality and deserving of the nod.

The quality was wonderful and it was great to see it. Our rears are getting better and so are our shoulders. I did see more missing teeth than I expected to see and the occlusion is something that needs to be worked on. The rears, in general, had good inner thigh muscle and proper angle. There were some straight rears but for the most part the rears looked good. I did not see a lot of "upright" tail sets, most were within the description of the standard.
