DPCA NATIONAL JUDGING COMMENTS



LESLIE HALL

INAUGURAL DPCA NATIONAL SWEEPSTAKES JUDGE

Where to start... It was an amazing experience, and I'd do it every year if they'd let me!

When I saw the entry I was flabbergasted, and immediately wondered how I was going to judge more than a hundred puppies and veterans and leave time for Doug Jensen to finish judging National Class dogs before midnight. So I decided I would do the minimum required by the AKC: Move as a group. Examine, move individually and call it a day. That's pretty close to what my procedure was.

Overall, the young Dobermans I got to put my hands on were beautiful examples of the breed. There were a few bite problems, and a few with missing teeth, a few with extra premolars. Feet were good, length of upper arms improved greatly. Temperaments were excellent and expressions, ear set and eye shape good. Eye color generally was dark, enough, and length of body shorter than I anticipated.

Outline: All parts fitting well; fore-and-hind quarters balanced, length of leg to depth of chest balanced. Thick hip-to-stifle and stifle-to-hock. Curvy underline, created by adequate forechest, depth, and length of ribcage going up to a short loin creating tuck-up. Strong pasterns and short hocks.

Boy, did many of the entry have all of the above! Movement was pretty good in all three directions. Sickie hocks are still in existence and I'd like to see them forever gone!

In Best Puppy I was ecstatic to look across the ring and see beautiful neck into shoulder, strong toplines, good tail sets (mostly!), I smiled and pointed to the 9-12 AOC dog. He's just yummy! There were so many good examples I could have shut my eyes and pointed. Good job to the breeders!

Then the Juniors. These were some stunning animals as well, the depth of quality in the total entry was exceptional. I flipped over the 12-18 month Black Bitch, my Best Jr. and Best in Sweepstakes. I could have created her outline from the Standard and drawn her as very close to my ideal. And she did not disappoint when she moved out of a stack. Again, my lineup for Best Junior was lovely and there were exceptional animals in every class!

On that day, the bitch beat the dog. When I pointed to her, Cindi Huckfeldt with Best Puppy went over and hugged Best in Sweepstakes handler Colleen Nicholson. Cindi looked at me and said "this is exactly how it went down in the Futurity!" "What?". said I. "Yup. She beat me yesterday too!" Then she said, "but that's okay!"

The Veterans. I knew it would be tough, but it was harder than I anticipated. Only first place in each class, that was rough. They all were amazing...the 11 and over red bitch had the crowd screaming - she showed like she was in the 6-9 month class. I teared up during Best, wanted to walk out without awarding the rosette because I did not want to pick just one. Ultimately, my Best Veteran in Sweepstakes was from the 9-11 year old male class...and he rocked the house.

I had a blast, and thank my stewards for keeping everything copacetic and running smoothly. And I thank each person for giving me their entry, I am humbled and joyful to have been given the opportunity to judge the inaugural DPCA National Sweepstakes. ▲

JOCELYN MULLINS

NATIONAL FUTURITY & MATURITY JUDGE

I would like to start with expressing my gratitude and appreciation to the membership that nominated me, and all who voted for me. It was truly a privilege and an honor for me to judge The 2015 Futurity and first ever maturity. This assignment gave me great pleasure and furthered my pride in our amazing breed. Knowing firsthand all the mental and physical work it takes to be a breeder and to raise your puppies to be the best possible little individuals that they can be. I know the hope Futurity & Maturity and expectation that grows with in a breeder as our puppies mature. I felt that these young hopefuls showed deep quality over all.



I was very pleased with the mouths I examined. In the past I've read judge's synopsis's where they discuss multiple missing teeth and occlusion issues. I did not find that to be the case within the field of dogs I had. I saw some lovely and strong bone but we still need more focus in this area to maintain and embody the appearance of being powerful.

I was over all pleased with the temperaments in the puppies. Many of them were outgoing, inquisitive and adventurous. All of the temperaments in the maturity animals I had were very good as well. Some of the dogs were more serious than others about their job but almost all of them seemed genuinely comfortable and happy to be there.

It's a given that it's going to be a long day and there's a lot of pressure on these young animals so my hats off to handlers for their guidance and and patience with these developing hopefuls, they deserve the best!

To give people an idea of my thought process as I judged, I would like to talk about what my interpretation of the Doberman standard is, what I look for when appreciating an exhibit and what I strive to achieve as a breeder.

The Doberman is a breed that is to be elegant in appearance but our elegance is to be on a powerful compact body. Our males and females should be equal in appearance with merely slight variables. A male should always be recognizable as a male, there should be no need for guessing. Our bitches should be a slightly smaller famine version, one with slightly softer features but still poses that powerful, elegant and commanding appearance. The musculature should be strong and pronounced not flat, weak or thin. Strong arched neck that smoothly joins a pronounced wither. The natural arch is were the elegance comes in their necks not a neck that is long and narrow. The arch is what makes our necks stand out among other breeds. I want them to be well muscled over the shoulders and outer thigh with proportionate inner thigh. From the base of the wither to the tip of the tail, I want a strong and uninterrupted line that becomes the croup that the tail comes off with a "slightly" rounded appearance. The tail is a continuation of the spine and its appearance should be as such. The front legs should come out of the body strait down from the highest point of the wither. From the front I want to see strong muscling over the shoulders. The muscle should look like a rounded and balanced protrusion on each side. Muscling the judge can cup their hands over during there exam. They should look like they could take you out with a direct or indirect hit. I want a noticeable but not exaggerated return to stifle. The rear should balance the front in bone, musculature and angle. Movement should be effortless yet very powerful, with extension of reach in the forequarters placing one foot after the other and a deliberate controlled drive in/off of their hindquarters with precise conversion. I do like to recognize and appreciate the qualities each dog has to offer.

In closing I would like to thank all of those who showed or had someone else show me their lovely animals. I congratulate the breeders, the owners and the handlers. I wish each and every entrant great success in the future!

DOUGLAS JENSEN – ALL REGULAR & NON REGULAR DOG CLASSES JUDGE



Decades of planning and preparation came together in a moment of time at a gathering in Lancaster, PA on October 1st. 2015. It was with extreme pleasure and anticipation that I judged the DPCA National Dog competition, something that I took very seriously and enjoyed completely. Our Standard is what is used to evaluate all animals in the ring and with that always in mind, I was allowed to be presented a stunning group of dogs from around the world. All of the dogs from the puppies to the veterans were great representatives of our breed and without exception were presented professionally. It took only a few minutes to find quality examples of the Doberman breed starting with the first puppy in the ring. After a late afternoon start and working into the evening, dogs were presented that demonstrated what our

Standard calls for in size, structure and nobility. Eye sets that warmed the heart and full mouths with great bites, strong toplines and clean movement, both down and back and side gates that covered ground. Judging each class and finding those animals that best represented our standard I had a great lineup for Winners Dog! I pulled several dogs into the middle of the ring and allowed them to show themselves as our breed so loves to do, and with that my Reserve Winner was from the Bred By Class AOAC, Schohaus Loyal Autumn Knight V Allure, a dog that fits our Standard and shows the heart of the Doberman. My Winners Dog came from the Puppy Dogs 6 to 9 Black Class #23 Legendale Abound Of Goldgrove, a young dog that shouted "Look at me", and showed his heart out with all of the others in the ring. Balanced and fitting all of the attitudes of our Standard the dog could not be denied.

The Stud Dog class demonstrated what as breeders we all strive to achieve, animals that produce better than themselves. GCh. Treu's The Whole Truth V Touchstone won the class and his get were exemplary specimens of the breed. I was impressed with all of the stud dogs and found the get of many of them really exciting. The Veterans were more that outstanding with many of them still in contention for breed wins and more, including GCh. Alisaton The Flight Of the Phonenix, a Top Twenty Winner of the past.

I truly loved the chance to judge our National and appreciate the confidence awarded me by our membership that allowed it to happen. A note of interest, when returning to my room following the assignment I pulled from my suit coat pocket the note pad provided by our wonderful Stewards that work every year to make the event successfully and the pad used to take notes on during judging had but one number written on it, #23. ▲

My WB was Can Ch. Liberators Delta Touche. I had no idea she was a Can Ch but not surprised. To me she epitomised the standard when standing and moving. Absolutely thrilled when she also took BOW.

My RWB Kettle Cove N Ashtrick over the Rainbow a young lady who also had all the attributes of the standard. In my opinion.

The final class of the day Brood Bitch was something to behold. I don't believe we have such a class in the UK. I judged the progeny and again wish I had had more ribbons. I found it such a fabulous class and very enjoyable.

Summing up. It was an absolute pleasure to have had so many gorgeous bitches to have my hands on many future Champions I have no doubt.

To all you breeders keep up the great work you are on the right track.

INTERSEX, JR. SHOWMANSHIP, BEST PUPPY, BEST BBE, BEST VETERAN JUDGE



There is nothing better in judging than to judge a National Specialty but when it is your own breed and your peers selected you, then it is as good as it gets.

I was unbelievably impressed at the depth of quality that was there. We have been struggling for numerous years with over angulation, sloped toplines, flat croups with high tail sets and the movement problems that come with each. I was so pleased to see so few Specials that had any of these issues.

The last time I judged at the National I judged bitches and was shocked at how many bad mouths I saw. This year in the Specials class of 147 I saw a total of ONE dog with missing teeth and no bad bites. CONGRATULATIONS everyone. Of course I saw very few correct occlusions and that is something everyone needs to work on.

There were so many possibilities that could have won this year it was wonderful. The beautiful red bitch that was the final winner fit our standard in almost every respect and she is one of the very few Dobermans that I have ever seen anywhere in the world that is exactly the same picture standing and moving which is what they should all be. My best opposite dog was such a correct Doberman according to our standard he could not be denied. From those two down to both selects and the final 10 awards of merits I cannot begin to tell how pleased I was with their quality. There was not a dog amongst the final 15 winners that I could not give a Group 1st to anywhere in the country.

Congratulations to all the breeders, the owners and the handlers of such a fabulous collection of dogs in such magnificent condition.
